

Dual Enrollment and Fast Forward Talking Points for High School Students

Program	Dual Enrollment	Fast Forward
Overview	Provides up to two college courses, tuition free, for eligible Vermont high school students. Upon successful completion of the course, the student will: (A) demonstrate proficiencies that contribute to a student meeting the graduation requirements of the secondary school in which the student is enrolled; and (B) earn postsecondary credit from the institution through which the course was offered.	Allows CTE students who meet the eligibility criteria to demonstrate CTE program proficiency and earn college credit for up to two college courses <i>per semester</i> taught at regional CTE centers.

Student Eligibility Details by Program

Program	Dual Enrollment	Fast Forward
Residency	Must be a Vermont resident	Available to all high school students enrolled in a secondary CTE program, including those who are not residents of Vermont, home study students, and those not currently enrolled in high school.
Grade	Junior & Senior	Sophomore, Junior & Senior
Voucher/Ticket Limit	2 per student	2 per semester
PLP Inclusion	Yes	Yes - for Vermont residents enrolled in high school

Eligibility	All juniors & seniors who are publicly funded	Sophomores, juniors, and seniors enrolled in CTE who meet eligibility requirements
Rate	Negotiated between AOE & VSC based on location and instructor type	Federal grant funds provide funding on a per course basis
Rate Coverage	Cost of tuition (up to 4 credits) per voucher	Colleges are provided a flat per course fee
Delivery Location	College campus, high school, or online	CTE Center or online
Instructor	College faculty or college approved high school faculty	CTE center faculty or CCV adjunct faculty
